

2018 Winter Travel League - Week # 6



49 of 60 shooters from the Winter Travel League posted scores this morning at the Portville Conservation Club. Randy Hill and the rest of the PCC crew ran a good, safe trap shoot today. The Club ran six squads per hour, which is better than the goal of five per hour for the league for the single trap field Clubs as 30 squads shot today. It was warmer again today, with temperatures in the mid-forties and just a bit of a breeze wind to deal with. The targets were very good.

Looking at the scores, Jake Bell of Eldred recorded a solid 97, followed by Bob DaPolito of Olean with a 96 for those that shot 100 targets today. Jim Green from Shinglehouse and MaKenzy Glover each had 49 x 50 for those shooting just 50 today. Jake had a 50-straight, running his last two fields. Other 25-straight were posted by: Bill Malone (twice), DaPolito, Green, Glover, Dominic Lockwood, Nick Galayda, Randy Ours and Gary Stuckey. Pat Dunn broke the **Green Bird**. Randy Ours donated the three bucks he won last week to the league. Thank you gramps. Randy Hill won the 50/50 drawing pocketing \$21. Our league membership now stands at a total of 60 members with one more week that shooters can still join the league. You'll notice the shooters have been divided into the three classes based on their season-long averages. They can (and will) change slightly by years' end. Our 500-bird, five-

club, traveling trap shooting league shoots Sunday mornings from 9 AM until 12:30 PM from January through the end of March. Gun safety is our top priority, so please think safety at all times; safety involving not only when shooting, but also driving to and from. Please print legibly when you sign up to shoot.

A 50-bird trophy shoot, steak dinner, and awards ceremony will be held at the Portville Conservation Club, (the league's host this year), on Sunday, March 25th. You must shoot the entire 500 targets to be eligible for the 50-bird trophy shoot. Shooters will be broken into three classes (A, B, & C) which are determined by their season-long average over the 500 targets. Whether you complete the entire 500-bird league or not you'll still get a steak dinner at the banquet for your \$15.
